

Why the focus on storm water?

Söderhamn has experienced several floodings, the most significant in the summer of 2013.

The challenges for Söderhamn:

Rising sea level
Changed precipitation
Changed water flows
Changed annual average temperature



iWater - Central Baltic

Start: December 1st 2015

End: August 31st 2018

Project budget: EUR 2.351.260

Söderhamn budget: EUR 309.950

The Municipality developed a storm water manangement strategy



Heawater - Central Baltic

Start: March 1st 2018

End: Februari 28th 2021

Project budget: EUR 1 898 349


Söderhamn budget: EUR 509.457

The Municipality developed two pilots; a vegetation pond and a ra garden. Storm water was monitored before and after the installing of the pilots.



Results





Monitoring shows that the level of suspended matter has gone from 85 to 25 mg/l. The concentration of phosphorus from 0,26 mg/l to 0,11 mg/l and for nitrogen in the form of ammonium <1.0 mg/l to 0,01 mg/l.

End: December 2021

Project budget: EUR 3.000.000

Söderhamn budget: EUR 209.900

A Storm Water Management Model (SWMM) is created for the area and calibrated on the basis of water flow measurements. The result: The Extreme Weather Layer (EWL) as a planning tool to create more flood resilient urban space.
